ROLE TITLE: Relapse Prevention Support Facilitator

LOCATION: Kempsey and surrounds

About the role

As a Relapse Prevention Support Facilitator with us, you will get to actively facilitate improved well-being for people to bring about positive and lasting change.

You will be supporting adults with a substance use disorder and complex needs. The program is available to anyone aged 18-65 years old who is receiving community based or other drug and alcohol (AOD) treatment.

It supports people on their recovery journey to connect with others, focus on their strengths, maintain a healthy lifestyle and lead a fulfilling life. This includes assistance with obtaining housing, education, training, employment and psychological counselling services.

This role is for 35 hours a week. The hours are flexible and can be negotiated to fit in with your lifestyle and commitments and so you can make the most of the 6 weeks of annual leave we offer pro rata. Team meetings are on Thursday mornings and other hours are negotiable. You are not expected to work on weekends. A pool car is available during working hours. This is a hybrid role offering options to work from home and in an office in Kempsey as well as in the community.

1. Tertiary qualifications in welfare/psychology/social work or relevant discipline.
2. Licences and checks: A current valid manual Driver's Licence, COVID vaccination, satisfactory current Criminal Record Check and Working with Children Check and a First Aid certificate are mandatory prior to commencement.

3. Demonstrated understanding of the recovery model and psychosocial rehabilitation and experience in coordinating care for persons with complex support needs including in particular Alcohol and other drugs (AOD) support needs co-occurring with significant mental health issues and other issues such as homelessness, trauma, contact with the criminal justice system and family and cultural separation.
4. Established networks and relationships with a range of services in the local area.
5. Computer literate in MS Office, video conferencing applications and a variety of databases.
