ROLE TITLE: Peer Worker: Safe Haven

LOCATION: working at both Lismore and Woodburn

About the role

As a Peer Worker with us, you will get to provide immediate trauma-informed and person-centred care to participants experiencing distress who present to the drop in Safe Haven hub.

The Buttery's Safe Havens provide a safe space for the community to walk in and connect with a team of people in a comfortable and approachable environment. Based in Lismore, Woodburn, Mullumbimby and Murwillumbah, we offer support and connection and someone to talk to at the time of need. To ensure they receive follow-up support, participants will be offered information or a link with psychological, psychosocial and other community supports, depending on their needs.

Hours and location: Safe Havens are open from 12-6pm seven days a week so capacity to work some weekends is required. The role is 35 hours per week and worked over 5 days with time for paperwork and training when havens are not open to the public. We have two peer roles based in either Lismore and Woodburn. Flexibility to work across both havens is required.

About you: Selection Criteria

1. Certificate IV or Mental Health or Certificate IV in Mental Health Peer Work or higher tertiary qualifications
2. A current Driver's Licence is required. A COVID vaccination, satisfactory current Criminal Record Check and Working with Children Check is mandatory prior to commencement.
3. At least one year's experience as a peer worker.
4. A personal experience of recovery from suicidality/mental health condition(s), with the capacity to outline the steps you took towards recovery and how you remain active in your recovery.
5. An understanding of trauma-informed care and strategies for suicide prevention.
6. Established networks and relationships with a with a range of referral services across the local community.
7. Capacity to work some weekends and current opening hours (12-6pm).
8. Demonstrated proficiency using the Microsoft suite, a variety of databases and video conferencing tools such as Zoom/Teams
