LOCATION: Tweed Heads

About the role

As an AOD Support Facilitator with us, you will get to support people in AOD recovery to connect with others, focus on their strengths and maintain a healthy lifestyle. This includes assistance with obtaining housing, education, training and employment. The target group are adults with a substance use disorder and complex needs. You'll find yourself in a position to support life changing outcomes.

Hours and location: The hours are 35 per week with no weekend work. This position is based in Tweed. The role is hybrid and mobile and operates from an office space, home and in the community. You will get to work with participants both online and face to face.

A vehicle is available from the Tweed office.

The role is funded until 30th June 2026 with potential for extension.

About you: Selection Criteria

- Diploma qualifications or above in welfare/psychology/social work or equivalent experience
- Current Driver's Licence; Satisfactory Criminal Record Check; Working with Children Check; COVID vaccination and First Aid Certificate.
